It was illegally dissolved by the government in 2009 alongside two other national organisations and thirteen international NGOs following the indictment of former President Omar Al-Bashir by the International Criminal Court.</p> <p>At the time of its closure in 2009, SUDO was the largest independent NGO in Sudan with 13 offices and over 500 employees and volunteers. The main goal of the Environmental Society is environmental conservation, but its activities cover all aspects related to development projects, with an emphasis on capacity building, raising awareness, and peacebuilding.</p> <p>The main objectives of the organisation are to support local communities in implementing environmentally sustainable development projects, mobilise its members to help local communities in their development, and raise awareness about the global, national, and local environmental problems with emphasis on priority issues faced by local communities. It also works to carry out research and study environmental issues that affect quality of life, create partnerships and work on local environmental problems.</p> <p>ES believes that conflict resolution and peacebuilding can be achieved through social work and the creation of appropriate links between different tribes and groups in conflict, making use of traditional norms and regulations that maintained harmony and coexistence in Sudan for generations. 	<p>Mubadiroon works on a range of conflict resolution and peacebuilding projects throughout Sudan. They have worked on community security and the training of demobilised soldiers. Mubadiroon has also provided training on conflict resolution for Native Administrations and community leaders in Sudan, and on capacity building for community-based organisations. A focus of this area of work has been on livelihoods and food security in areas affected by war.</p> <p>Mubadiroon's learning from working in Sudan includes the importance of working with volunteers, and the need to deal directly with beneficiaries in local communities in project design and implementation. It also stresses the need for strong partnerships with other organisations to facilitate information exchange and allow these to benefit from the capabilities of others, and the importance of learning from local organisations.</p>	
<p>Sudanese Studies Centre (SSC)</p>	<p>http://ssc-sudan.org/</p> <p>Established in 1989, SSC is a centre for research and dialogue on various aspects of Sudanese life. By emphasizing diversity and the plurality of cultures, the Centre aims to make peace a practical, living aspect of Sudanese life, rather than just a theory.</p> <p>Every year the organisation focuses on a different issue. Currently the SSC is establishing a democracy library which will contain over 600 books. The library will be developed into a democracy and peace unit which will offer training and teachings on democracy and how to practice peace in real life, targeting young people in particular. SSC have also translated two important books: the first by Ahmed Khair, former Sudanese Minister of Foreign Affairs (one of founders of the democratic library); and the second by Mohamed Ahmed Mahjoub, former Prime Minister of Sudan, who participated in the independence movement.</p> <p>SSC workshops and seminars seek to answer various practical questions, for example 'how do people actually practice peace and how do people act peacefully?'. Babiker Badri Scientific Association for Women's Studies	<p>http://www.ahfad.org/babiker%20badri.html</p> <p>Babiker Badri is Sudan's longest-established association for women's training, empowerment and peacebuilding. Babiker Badri works to empower Sudanese women, promoting greater equality and participation in community life. It also challenges the practice of female genital mutilation, encourages women to act as advocates for gender equality, and helps women pursue income-generating activities.</p> <p>Enjoying a solid reputation in its field, Babiker Badari operates throughout the country. The Association worked in the past to raise awareness and understanding of the terms of Sudan's Comprehensive Peace Agreement (CPA). They commissioned writers to dramatize the treaty and approached famous actors to perform it on tour between March and December 2007. Babiker Badari felt that women and young people had a particularly limited awareness of the CPA and were therefore being excluded from the peace process. The project therefore aimed to convey relevant information about the CPA directly and effectively.</p>	All Sudan

It was formed to advance cooperation and solidarity through collective response to violations of women rights in Sudan and fight all kinds of abuse facing women because of their gender.</p>	All Sudan

	<p>In particular, the initiative was sparked by the incident of police forces arresting Sudanese female journalist Lubna Hussein for wearing trousers and accusing her of a violation of the Sharia based Public Order Act. In response to that incident and several other women's rights violations, women's rights activists in Sudan organised to fight against the public order laws and unlawful abuses against women in Sudan.</p> <p>Its activities include monitoring violations of women's human rights in the country, advocacy and awareness raising campaigns, outreach and workshops designed to empower women to exercise their rights and resist the unjust laws, and legal aid. It also organises prison visits and monitors the situation of women, particularly the victims of public order laws such as local alcohol brewers and tea sellers.</p>
